#### **ENTRIES AND CLOSING DATES**

Entries must be received by Wednesday, June 24<sup>th</sup>. Entries will be accepted by special delivery services ONLY IF THE SIGNATURE WAIVER is signed. No telephone entries will be accepted. Entries received after the closing date will be returned. There is no limit to the number of dogs that can participate in this agility trial. Competitors may enter both Championship and Performance Program classes for which they are eligible; however, under NO circumstances may a dog be entered in the same Championship and Performance class at this agility test (i.e. standard at any level in both programs).

You may request a change in or cancel your entry in writing, via U.S. postal service or email [spottedwoz@comcast.net](mailto:spottedwoz@comcast.net) at any time prior to the closing date. Secondary closing deadline (Monday July 6<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 pm) is for ADVANCEMENT IN LEVEL ONLY. No refundable cancellations or changes in classes will be permitted after the closing date.

#### **CHECK-IN AND MEASURING**

All competitors must check in their first day of competition. All dogs must be measured prior to being checked in unless the handler sent a copy of the permanent card with entry, the dog jumps 26" (P22"), the handler presents a permanent card, temporary card with 3 signatures awaiting a CMJ or check-in letter issued by USDAA/print out of dog info page from subscriber account indicating the dog is permanently carded. You may attach a copy of your yellow permanent USDAA height card to your entry to expedite check-in. Those who cannot present their permanent card, completed temporary card or USDAA check-in letter will be required to measure in. **Please do not mail actual cards or copies of blue cards.** There will be a self-serve check-in list for those having a permanent card and have sent a copy of it with the entry form.

**Check-in and measuring times will be between 7:30 am. and 8:00 am. both days.**

**Judge's briefing for the first class will be at 8:15, with first dog on the line at 8:30 am. sharp.**

Confirmation of entry and final confirmation with last minute details of the trial will be by EMAIL ONLY. If email is not available to a competitor, please send a self-addressed stamped envelope and the final details will be sent after the secondary closing deadline Monday July 6<sup>th</sup>.

#### **PRIZES AND AWARDS**

Ribbons will be awarded to 1<sup>st</sup> thru 4<sup>th</sup> place in all test classes in each respective jump height.

Pairs Relay will be awarded by Mini and Open divisions, 1<sup>st</sup> thru 4<sup>th</sup>.

Maroon Qualifying ribbons will be awarded for qualifying scores in ALL titling classes.

Ribbons will be awarded to 1<sup>st</sup> thru 3<sup>rd</sup> place in Grand Prix and Performance National Standard.

Special qualifying ribbons will be awarded to all Grand Prix and PNS qualifiers.

#### **NOTICE TO COMPETITORS**

- Competitors, through submission of entry, acknowledge that they are knowledgeable of USDAA® Rules and Regulations, as amended March 30, 2007, including but not limited to the following rules regarding entry, and will comply. USDAA's official Rules and Regulations are hereby incorporated by reference.
- This test is open to all dogs being at least 18 months of age including purebred and non-purebred, except bitches in season, dogs suffering from any deformity, injury or illness which may affect the dog's physical or mental performance, or dogs exhibiting signs of aggression.
- To be accepted, entries must be complete, signed (by parent or guardian for minors), received by the closing date, and accompanied by the correct fees.
- All dogs must be registered with the USDAA® (registration has "U" prefix). A registration form is enclosed with this Agility Test Schedule. This form must be completed and submitted with all entries that do not bear a valid USDAA® registration number.

Following are the jump heights for the Championship Program (Performance Program obstacles in parentheses):

\*\* Note: The actual height of the A-Frame may vary depending on the angle as measured at the apex.

- All Competitors, through entry at this event, waive any and all rights relative to video broadcast of this event. Competitors shall have the right to videotape portions of this event for their personal use only. No portion of this event may be videotaped for commercial or other purposes. All video, broadcast and telecast rights for this event are the exclusive property of the United States Dog Agility Association, Inc.
- Portions of this event may be taped for television. Through entry at this event, ALL COMPETITORS AND HANDLERS HEREBY GRANT to USDAA<sup>®</sup> and its representatives, agents and assigns, all rights and permission to use or appropriate his/her and their dogs name, biography, likeness, photograph, voice, performing persona, or other indicia of identity for broadcast, telecast, cablecast, transmission or distribution in any format or media now known or hereafter to become known. All Competitors and handlers hereby release USDAA<sup>®</sup> and its representatives, agents and assigns from any claim or cause of action for invasion of the rights of privacy, right of publicity, right of personality, or any similar right.
- No leads or collars (except as allowed in the USDAA<sup>®</sup> Rules), food, toys or other aids or devices shall be permitted on the course at any time.
- Safety shall always be of foremost consideration in actions and conduct by handlers at all times.
- The Organizing Committee of an event may refuse the entry of any competitor or dog for just cause should the committee views that participation by competitor or dog would be prejudicial to the sport. However, any committee so doing must notify the competitor in writing (with a copy to the USDAA<sup>®</sup> office) in anticipation of or upon receipt of entry. The notice must include the reason for refusing the entry and a brief explanation of the basis for their decision. The burden of responsibility for appropriateness of such action rests solely with the host group and its Organizing Committee.
- Agility obstacles shall meet the requirements of USDAA<sup>®</sup> Rules and Regulations.
- Fault limits may be imposed at the discretion of the organizing committee and/or judge.

**ADDITIONALLY:**

- A withdrawal after the closing date due to injury or illness of the entered dog, or for bitches who come into season after the closing date will be eligible for a refund minus USDAA<sup>®</sup> fees plus a service fee of \$5 if supported by a written notice from a veterinarian. In such instances the secretary MUST be notified no later than Friday, July 3rd, with supporting documentation received by Wednesday July 8th. Any other withdrawals after the closing date will not be eligible for refund.
- THERE SHALL BE NO REFUNDS in the event a dog and/or handler are dismissed from competition, regardless of the reason for dismissal, or in the event that the test cannot be opened or completed for reasons beyond the control of the organizing committee.
- There will be no refund for overpayment of fees in the amount of \$10 or less/dog.
- Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry fee. There will be a \$20.00 service charge on all returned checks and repeat episodes may require future payment to be a M.O. or Cashier's Check. Payment of entry fees and services shall be made within 30 days of postmark of notice of returned check. Any fees not received within 30 days of notice will result in cancellation of event results for all classes for the registration numbers(s) of delinquent entry/entries. No reinstatement of results is possible. All awards must be returned within 10 days of notification, or the dog's registration may be suspended pending restitution. Any unpaid fees or shortfalls must be paid prior to the start of the event or entry is cancelled without recourse by owner/handler.
- There will **not** be a food vendor available on site. Lunch and bottled water will be available on-site for WORKERS ONLY ☺. However, there are some restaurants nearby in the Dexter & Ann Arbor areas.
- Dogs must be properly kenneled (in crate or pen) or attended (held on leash) at all times except at the warm-up jump or in the ring.
- There will be no electrical hook up for competitors.
- There will be NO equipment familiarization at this event.
- Exhibition Runs (FEO) are permitted only for dogs that "measure up" into a higher height class than that which they entered; however, no qualifying scores or awards may be earned and no change in program is permitted at check-in.

**PLEASE MAKE SPECIAL NOTE:**

\*Please respect the owners and neighbors by exercising your dogs in designated areas. Do NOT walk your dogs on the neighboring business properties. Those that violate this will be asked to leave the trial without refund. Also PLEASE PICK UP AFTER YOUR DOGS! We want to use this site for future trials. This includes those staying in motels.

\* There is ample parking behind the building and across the street. There is limited RV/trailer parking across the street.

\*Trial will be run indoors, on rubber matting. The building is climate controlled. In case of inclement weather, please take care & wipe your dogs' feet to prevent injury. Rubber mat flooring can get slippery when wet!

\* There is ample room for crating and chairs but keep in mind that USDAA<sup>®</sup> offers unlimited entries, so please be conscientious of the space that you use. NO LIVING ROOM SETUPS. We will ask you to minimize your crating area for any that gets excessively large. Please be courteous to other competitors.

## **CLASS DESCRIPTIONS**

Two certification programs will be offered at this event – Championship & Performance. Competitors may enter both Championship and Performance Program classes for which they are eligible; however, under NO circumstance may a dog be entered in the same Championship and Performance class at this agility test (i.e. standard at any level in both programs). Classes include standard agility, gamblers, jumpers, pairs relay and snooker agility as set forth in Chapters 3 – 7 of USDAA® Rules and Regulations, each of which are conducted at three competitive levels.

### **Championship Dog Agility Program**

The Starters Standard classes shall be for dogs that have not earned the *Agility Dog*® title or a Starters Standard title. Starters Non-standard classes shall be for dogs that have not earned a title in the class being entered (Starters Gamblers, Starters Jumpers, Starters Relay-3 different partners required-or Starters Snooker) or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard class at the Advanced or Masters level. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the nonstandard classes is required to earn the *Agility Dog* title.

The Advanced Standard classes shall be for dogs that have earned the *Agility Dog*® title or a Starters Standard title. Advanced non-standard classes shall be for dogs that have earned the *Agility Dog*® title or that have earned a title in the equivalent non-standard class at the Starters level, but have not earned the equivalent Advanced non-standard title or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard class at the Masters level. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the nonstandard classes is required to earn the *Advanced Agility Dog* title.

The Masters Standard classes shall be for dogs that have earned the *Advanced Agility Dog*® title or the *Advanced Standard* title. Masters non-standard classes shall be for dogs that have earned the *Advanced Agility Dog*® title, the equivalent non-standard title at the Advanced level, or that had previously qualified for entry into the equivalent Masters non-standard class prior to January 1, 2004.

### **Performance Program Classes**

Generally, Performance Level I, Level II and Level III are run on courses used for Starters, Advanced and Masters classes in the Championship Program, with the following exceptions: the A-frame is set at 5'6", jump heights are one height class lower as set forth in Notes to Competitors, no spread hurdles are utilized and time standards in the standard, jumpers classes are extended by 3 seconds beyond that utilized in the Championship Program and the pairs relay class is non-qualifying. Eligibility is determined as follows:

The Performance I Standard classes shall be for any dog that has not earned the *Performance Dog I*<sup>SM</sup> title, the *Performance Standard I* title, or a qualifying score in the *Performance II* or *Performance III* standard classes. Performance I non-standard classes shall be for any dog that has not earned a title in the class being entered (*Performance I Gamblers*, *Performance I Jumpers*, or *Performance I Snooker*) or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard class at the *Performance II* or *Performance III* level. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the non-standard classes is required to earn the *Performance Dog I*<sup>SM</sup> title.

The Performance II Standard classes shall be for any dog that has earned the *Performance Dog I*<sup>SM</sup> title, the *Performance Standard I* title, the *Agility Dog*® title or the *Veteran Agility Dog*<sup>SM</sup> title, but has not earned the *Performance Dog II*<sup>SM</sup> title or *Performance Standard II* title, or a qualifying score in the *Performance III* standard class. Performance II non-standard classes shall be for dogs having earned the *Performance Dog I*<sup>SM</sup> title, the *Agility Dog*® title or a title in the equivalent Starters or *Performance I* non-standard class, but not having earned a title in the equivalent non-standard *Performance II* class or a qualifying score in the equivalent non-standard *Performance III* class. Three qualifying scores in the standard class from two different judges along with one qualifying score in each of the nonstandard classes is required to earn the *Performance Dog II*<sup>SM</sup> title.

The Performance III Standard classes shall be for any dog that has earned the *Performance Dog II*<sup>SM</sup> title, the *Performance Standard II* title, the *Advanced Agility Dog*<sup>SM</sup> title, or the *Veteran Advanced Agility Dog*<sup>SM</sup> title. Performance III non-standard classes shall be for dogs having earned the *Performance Dog II*<sup>SM</sup> title, the *Advanced Agility Dog*® title, the equivalent non-standard title at the Advanced or *Performance II* level, or that had previously qualified for entry into the equivalent *Performance* non-standard class prior to January 1, 2004.

### **Nonstandard Class Descriptions**

Gamblers class: The competition consists of a course with no pre-determined route and each obstacle is assigned a point value. In the 'opening' period the handler seeks to accumulate points by performing the obstacles of his/her choice in the time allotted. At the conclusion of the 'opening' the handler attempts the 'gamble', a sequence designated by the judge to be handled from a distance, for additional points. This nonstandard class is pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 6 and 7 of USDAA® Rules and Regulations.

Jumpers class: consists of a course of jumps and may include a tire and tunnels. This nonstandard class is scored pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 6 and 7 of USDAA® Rules and Regulations.

Snooker class: has an 'opening' sequence of point collection similar to the Gamblers class followed by a closing sequence of a set pattern. Roughly parallels the billiards game of 'Snooker', requiring the dog to successfully complete a 'red' jump prior to attempting an obstacle designated as any other color. This nonstandard class is scored pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 6 and 7 of USDAA® Rules and Regulations.

Pairs Relay: consists of a standard course with one dog and handler doing a portion of the course, followed by a baton exchange to a second handler and dog who do the second portion of the course. Partners must be in the same level and height division, mini (CH 12/16, Perf 8/12) or open (Ch 22/26, Perf 16/22). In the event only one dog is entered in a program/level, un-entered dogs or dogs from other programs/levels may NOT be recruited to form a qualifying pair. This nonstandard class is scored pursuant to the provisions of Chapters 6 and 7 of USDAA® Rules and Regulations.

## **2009 Grand Prix of Dog Agility® World Championships & 2009 Performance National Standard<sup>SM</sup> (Local Qualifier)**

These tournaments are open to all competitors regardless of titles earned or skill level. Both are a single round tournament featuring the sport in its basic form. The course includes obstacles as set forth in chapter 3 of USDAA Rules and Regulations for standard agility, except that no table shall be used. Standard scoring shall be applied. Competitors must have a ZERO fault round to earn a qualifying score for which qualifying ribbons are presented. One qualifying score is required for entry in Round 1 of a Regional Championships. Additionally, the first place competitor in each height class who has earned a qualifying score shall be eligible to enter the final round of a Type 1 Regional Championship without regard to their score in the first round. Such eligibility shall be documented through a "bye" voucher. A competitor may earn more than one voucher, and the voucher is nontransferable, can be used only once and must be submitted with the competitors entry form for a Type 1 Regional Championship. See complete rules and regulations for Regional Championships, which are hereby incorporated by reference.

**SPECIAL NOTES:** When a local qualifier is held in conjunction with an agility test where all levels of titling are NOT being offered, 'bye' vouchers will not be awarded. (e.g...Starters/Advanced only, Advanced/Masters only, Masters only-Tournament Only shows do not fall into this category) Competitors with a qualifying score placing first in a jump height shall be named Regional Champion and earn a bye into the World Championship semifinals. Additionally, competitors with a qualifying score in the top 50% in each height class shall earn a bye into the semifinals at the World Cynosport Games. If at a regional championship a bye is earned by a competitor/dog team who has already earned a bye in that jump height, the bye is forfeited.

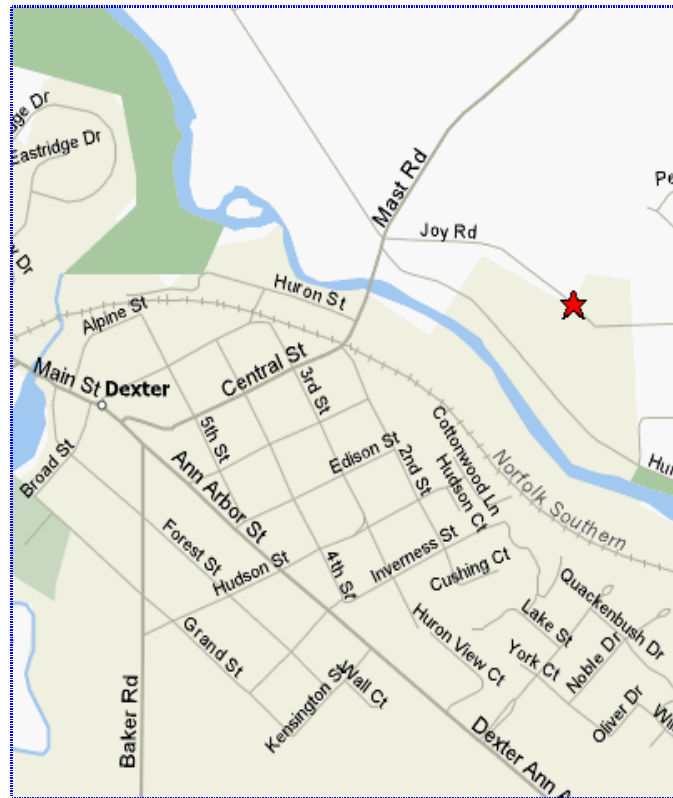
The rules may be found on the USDAA web site—General Information—Forms and Documents Library, or may be requested in writing by US mail from the USDAA office. A competitor must have two qualifications from local qualifiers, one of which may be from the first round of a Regional Championship, in order to qualify for entry to the world championship quarterfinals: however, when a competitor may choose to compete in both Grand Prix and Performance National standard qualifiers during the current tournament season, the competitor is only eligible to compete in the championships of the tournament in which they have earned the most qualifications. Further, 2009 tournament rules stipulate that a competitor must compete all in Championship or all in Performance tournaments at Regional and National/World Championships.

**Awards:** First through third place in each height class will receive placement ribbons. All qualifiers receive qualifying ribbons.

**Directions to the trial site:**

**From I-94 (heading west):** Take Zeeb Road exit and head north.

Cross the Huron River and then railroad tracks. At the stop sign turn left onto Huron River Dr.. Pass Dexter-Huron Metro Park on your left. Approximately 1.5 miles down make a right turn onto the cross drive connecting CSRC to Joy Road. The building at the corner is the Dexter Research Center (7300 Huron River Dr.). There is also a sign for "Dexter Martial Arts". CSRC is the large building up the drive.

**From I-94 (heading east):** Take Baker Road exit and head north.

Stay on Baker Rd. until it ends in downtown Dexter (see map above). Turn left onto Ann Arbor St. and take the immediate right onto Central St. You have to go around 'Monument Park'. Stay on Central and cross the Huron River. There is a party store on the corner where Huron River Dr. and Mast Rd. intersect. Turn right onto Joy Rd. and go approximately 1/4 mile until you see a sign for "Dexter Martial Arts". Turn right onto that drive and CSRC is the building immediately on your right. Parking is available in the back and side of the building.

**From US-23 (Heading south):** Take North Territorial Rd. exit and head west.

Go approximately 5.5 miles west until you come to a 4-way stop. Turn left onto Mast Rd. and go 3 miles to Joy Rd. (speed limit will drop to 25 here). The Dexter party store is on the left. Turn before the party store, onto Joy Rd., and go approximately 1/4 mile until you see a sign for "Dexter Martial Arts". Turn right onto that drive and CSRC is the building immediately on your right. Parking is available in the back and side of the building.

**From US-23 (Heading north)** Take M-14 West towards Ann Arbor.

Take Miller Rd. exit. At the end of the exit ramp go past the stop street (Maple Rd.) and you will come to Miller Rd. Turn right onto Miller Rd. and head West to Zeeb Rd. (second stop sign). Turn right onto Zeeb Rd. and the first stop is Huron River Dr. Turn left onto Huron River Dr. and approximately 1.5 miles down make a right turn onto the cross drive connecting CSRC to Joy Road. The building at the corner is the Dexter Research Center (7300 Huron River Dr.). There is also a sign for "Dexter Martial Arts". CSRC is the large building up the drive.
